

The Photo Hunt

All 339 subjects, chosen by the archive rather than by taste: the places the encyclopedia refers to most, plus every tree, bird, plant and surface material the surveys document. The number beside each is a measurement and the groups do not compare — each group says what its own number counts. Entries marked **DO NOT APPROACH** — 11 of them — are protected, rare or colonial nesters: photograph those from distance, or not at all.

Animals come from GBIF public human observations. A count is not an abundance: bald eagle leads partly because eagles are conspicuous and partly because people report eagles.

Ground is mapped Quaternary surface material. Two entries describe bedrock mapped *beneath* the island; mapping is not outcrop, so do not go looking for a cliff.
